Election Held

- 1) Vice President Election Held: Paul Dyer and R.A. Cantrell candidates. Paul Dyer was elected as our new Vice President.
- 2) Erica Scott was elected as Secretary by motion and approval of membership present.

New Business

1. Treasurer's report read and accepted. Note that budget of \$5,000.00 per month available for remodeling. Treasurer's report will be on SAGC website eventually.
2. Bid accepted from Ralph Goble to dig out the pond and agreed upon by membership. Bid was to not exceed \$3,500 with Club approval. Pond will be North and East of Bay 5, approximately 9 feet deep with deep enough side towards neighboring property to keep silt from contaminating runoff to their property. There will be a grade open so that we can remove silt periodically. The design is such that water runoff will slow as it approaches the pond and in the pond the silt will settle. More discussion was on drainage across the new ranges and more information is needed for a decision. Once the pool is completed and information gathered, the drainage can be done and the upper road work completed. Pretty much every week the big equipment is working to make our range safer and better. All have seen members trimming weeds and cleaning up. The covers have been moved from the old ranges and are ready for us to set up at the new ranges once the road has been completed. It won't be done overnight but progressing steadily. Join us at the next meeting Tuesday, November 22nd at 7pm next door to The Outdoorsman.
3. **Auto Benchrest Association notes with Ron Herring: Joe Chacon** shot a 200 last week in the Unlimited Class at San Angelo—that just doesn't happen folks. Not in .22 rimfire at our Range, at least. It was never done in ABRA (Auto Benchrest Association); there have been 250's in IR 50/50; but not with 25 X's!! That is only the **Second 200**, shot in 3 years in the Auto Benchrest Association- Joe shot the first one last year. This is one of Joe's rifles with a Douglas barrel on it and he said it shoots better and better. Darek Biggs is still our only Junior shooter and he is a great guy to shoot with. He had an aggregate of 178.500—keep it up Darek! Joe Chacon did take

1st Place in the Senior Unlimited with an aggregate of 197.250 and he had high 2nd and 3rd targets with a 200 and a 196. Lisa Chacon took 2nd Place with an aggregate of 195.000 had high 1st and 4th targets with a 198 (tiebreaker with Joe) and a 197. Michael Kirkpatrick was 3rd with a 193.000 aggregate. Ron Herring took 1st place in the Senior Factory Class with a 182.250 aggregate and had high 1st, 2nd, 3rd targets with 182;187;185. Jim Swaringin was 2nd with an aggregate of 180.500, John Pormann was 3rd with an aggregate of 176. David Russell suffered some firearm issues on the 2nd target but came back to take high 4th target with a 178, breaking a tie with Jim Swaringin. My rifle got wacky on me on the last target and the wind didn't help. It was a great day to be at the Range with some great friends and competitors. This concludes our 2016 season with all of us looking forward to the Texas State Match at Boerne on November 12th.
